

## **PROGRAMS** & SERVICES

FearlsNotLove serves approximately 20,000 individuals each year through a comprehensive range of innovative programs and services, from prevention and education to counselling and emergency supports.

We lead with a unique approach. We believe that violence and abuse is a choice, and our approach honours the many ways people resist domestic violence and abuse and identifies abuse as a behaviour that can change.



#### **CONNECT DOMESTIC VIOLENCE & ABUSE** HELPLINE

Provides crisis counselling, safety planning, information, intake into all FearlsNotLove programs and referrals to community resources. Trained counsellors answer the phone 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Multi-lingual and email support are also available.



#### CALGARY WOMEN'S **EMERGENCY** SHELTER

A safe haven and secure shelter for adults who identify as women, with or without children, who are fleeing domestic violence and abuse. Some rooms can accommodate pets, which can often be a barrier for individuals leaving dangerous and unsafe situations.



#### COMMUNITY **SERVICES** COUNSELLING

Offers counselling, safety planning, parenting support and navigation of community resources to any person in the community experiencing domestic violence and abuse in their close relationships. Counselling is offered in-person at a safe location or virtually.



#### COURT **PROGRAM**

Help with navigation of the court system for anyone who has or is experiencing domestic violence and abuse.



#### **MEN'S RESOURCE** LINE

Phone counselling. information and support for individuals around emotional and relational wellness. Available 24 hours per day, 365 days a year.



#### **HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS** PROGRAM FOR YOUTH

Violence prevention counselling for youth experiencing struggles or have concerns with a peer, family or dating relationship. Individual or group counselling is offered in schools for both victims or those who use abuse.



#### MEN'S COUNSELLING **SERVICE**

Individual and group counselling for adults interested in creating or enhancing safety in their close relationships. By recognizing their abilities and power to change, we support adults in addressing their controlling or abusive behaviours and how it negatively impacts their close relationships.

An educational program designed to help informal responses to people who are experiencing domestic the home. violence and abuse.

#### Imminent Risk Hotel Project

For individuals living in dangerous and unhealthy situations, the threat of serious harm is increasing. We remain committed to reducing the risk of lethality due to domestic violence and abuse. In response to growing need, we launched the Imminent Risk Hotel Project in 2023. This initiative provides emergency accommodation for individuals in immediate danger who cannot access our shelter or other local options due to capacity limits. These hotel stays offer the same level of support and safety planning as our Calgary Women's Emergency Shelter. In the last fiscal year, we provided 282 hotel nights. Demand has been unpredictable, reflecting the urgent and volatile nature of these situations. This project allows us to respond quickly, offering safety and stability at critical times while working toward personalized, longer-term solutions for each person or family we serve.

## Safety and Repair with Tod Augusta Scott

In partnership with Men & and Forge Centre for Dignity-Driven Leadership, Tod Augusta Scott joined us for two presentations of the Safety and Repair Workshop. The training introduced individual practitioners and organizations to a process to address gender-based violence which seeks to repair harm without creating more harm. Typically involving two practitioners - one for each person, the approach follows a 3-phase process. Participants learned tools and principles from Narrative Therapy, Trauma Work, and Restorative Justice, with a focus on repairing harm and not necessarily on restoring intimate relationships. Each phase explores how gender expectations and trauma can foster abuse and hinder people's ability to repair harm, both when they are hurt and then they hurt others. The workshop aimed to strengthen the domestic violence sector's capacity in our community to build skills and enhance services. Thank you to Counselling Alberta and Calgary Counselling Centre for supporting the second workshop that was presented in April 2025.

#### Take A Stand— Interactive Digital Toolkit Recognize, Respond and Refer


For more than 10 years, FearlsNotLove has been dedicated to educating and empowering the community to effectively support victims of domestic violence and abuse with the Take A Stand Initiative. Originally taking form as group presentations and online webinars, it has now evolved into more accessible and engaging interactive online toolkits. available to everyone. In 2024, the Recognize, Respond and Refer self-quided toolkit was launched. Designed for individuals to work at their own pace, it provides information about this critical issue, and practical ways to offer informed, compassionate support to someone who maybe living in fear in their close relationships. Offering non-judgemental, empathetic support is a powerful way to help end domestic violence and make positive change in our community.





## TREASURER'S REPORT

Demand for our services continues to be heightened with revenue increasing 7% year-over-year, and through careful expense management our expenses are relatively flat year over year, leading to a small deficit. This results in our third consecutive deficit albeit the smallest one of the three. Given our previous surpluses we are still well positioned to serve the community, but these deficits cannot continue in perpetuity.

The organization is focused on engaging our donors and finding sustainable sources of funding to meet the ever growing and changing needs of our community. We appreciate the ongoing support of the community, our donors, and all stakeholders as we continue to work towards a community free from fear, neglect, violence and abuse.




